# **Synopsis**

## ACT 1

King Ouf, in disguise, searches for a suitable subject to execute as the grand finale to his birthday celebrations.

Ambassador Hérisson de Porc-Épic and his wife, Aloès, arrive, accompanied by his secretary, Tapioca, and Laoula, the daughter of a neighbouring monarch. They are travelling incognito, and the princess is being passed off as Hérisson's wife. Their mission, of which Laoula is unaware, is to marry her to King Ouf.

Complications arise when Laoula and Lazuli, a poor peddler, fall in love at first sight. Lazuli believes Laoula's marriage to Hérisson prevents their courtship.

Wanting to be left alone, Lazuli insults the disguised king and thus becomes the perfect candidate for death by impalement. Sirocco, the king's astrologer, reveals that the fates of the king and Lazuli are linked; the stars predict that if one dies, the other will follow within a day.

His life now precious, Lazuli is pardoned and escorted with honours into the palace.

# ACT 2

Lazuli grows bored with the luxury of the palace and longs for Laoula. He confesses to Ouf and Sirocco that he is in love with a married woman, and they encourage him to pursue her.

Ouf, still unaware of the disguises, imprisons Laoula's supposed husband, Hérisson, furthering Laoula and Lazuli's hopes of being together. Ouf determines to marry Aloès (who is in love with the secretary Tapioca) and Laoula and Lazuli secretly elope. Hérisson escapes and orders Lazuli to be shot.

Laoula is found safe and well, but Lazuli is presumed dead. Recalling the astrologer's earlier prediction, Ouf bemoans his own impending death.

# ACT 3

Lazuli, who survived the gunshot, overhears Ouf, Sirocco, and Hérisson discussing the situation, and decides to reveal himself to Laoula. They plan a second elopement.

The king and Sirocco turn to alcohol and try to raise their spirits with a shot of chartreuse. Ouf, desperate to marry and secure an heir to the throne, decides to marry Laoula, despite only having hours to live. However, when the time comes, Ouf does not die, and Lazuli is found.

All ends well. Ouf renounces his claim to Laoula, and everyone rejoices as the two lovers are reunited.



#### MARTIN PICKARD

After studying at Cambridge University and the Royal College of Music, Martin Pickard began his career in Germany, working as a repetiteur, conductor, and chorusmaster in the opera houses of Kiel and Nuremberg. On returning to the UK, he joined Opera North, where he conducted more than 30 different productions including The Return of Ulysses, The Marriage of Figaro, Macbeth, La Traviata, Falstaff, Carmen, Boris Godunov, Eugene Onegin, La Bohème, The Snow Maiden, Madama Butterfly, Der Rosenkavalier and Peter Grimes. From 2008 - 2015 he was Opera North's Head of Music.

Alongside his work for Opera North, Martin has also worked with English National Opera, Opéra Les Azuriales, Bregenzer Festspiele, Buxton Festival, Perth International Arts Festival (Western Australia), and Matav Hungarian Symphony Orchestra (Budapest). In 2004, he conducted performances of Strauss's *Die Frau ohne Schatten* at the Tiroler Landestheater (Innsbruck) in a production by Brigitte Fassbaender.

A long association with the Glyndebourne Festival has seen him working there as an assistant and senior coach for conductors including Vladimir Jurowski, Jiří Bělohlávek, and Robin Ticciati. In 2006, he made his Glyndebourne conducting début with *The Bartered Bride*.

Between 2011 and 2016 he was part of the team which developed Opera North's acclaimed *Ring Cycle*, conducted by Richard Farnes. Between 2018 and 2024 he was assistant conductor on the London Philharmonic Orchestra's *Ring Cycle*, conducted by Vladimir Jurowski.

Martin is also active as a pianist, appearing with singers including Lesley Garrett, Catherine Wyn-Rogers, Fflur Wyn, Ilker Arcayürek and Brindley Sherratt. He is a visiting lecturer at the University of Leeds and a visiting coach at the RNCM, the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, the National Opera Studio, and the Oxenfoord International Summer School.

#### **MARK BURNS**

Mark Burns grew up in Buxton and studied at the Royal Northern College of Music. He regularly works with many of the UK's major opera companies such as Royal Opera, Scottish Opera and Welsh National Opera. He also has a close association with Buxton International Festival for whom he has directed numerous productions including Tisbe, Lucio Papirio Dittatore and La Voix Humaine, the latter starring Dame Felicity Lott. He was also Associate Board Member of Buxton International Festival for several years until 2021. Mark has a passion for working with young artists and has directed at the Royal Academy of Music and Royal Northern College of Music, as well as working with the Emerging Artists at Scottish Opera. Previously, Mark has assisted Sir Thomas Allen on his productions of Don Giovanni and The Barber of Seville for Scottish Opera. Mark has also recently revived Silent Opera's production of Vixen at the Hong Kong Arts Festival.

#### **ADRIAN LINFORD**

Adrian was born in Cambridgeshire, trained at Wimbledon School of Art, and now lives in London.

His credits in the UK and Europe include Manon Lescaut, Hansel and Gretel, the UK première of Jake Heggie's opera Dead Man Walking, Street Scene, Agrippina, and Judith Weir's The Vanishing Bridgegroom. He designed costumes for Eugene Onegin and L'elisir d'amore (both for West Green Opera), with further designs including The Tempest and Henry V (Shakespeare's Rose Theatre, York), King Lear (UK Tour), and The Winter's Tale. He also designed the current production of The Marriage of Figaro in Lübeck, Germany, Il turco in Italia (Nantes/Luxembourg Opera), and Sondheim's Sunday in the Park with George (Théâtre du Châtelet, Paris).

His designs for *Bluebeard's Castle*, originally staged in London (where it won the Royal Philharmonic Award for Opera), have since been presented in Atlanta, Toronto (nominated for Best Opera Design at the Dora Awards), New Zealand, the Edinburgh International Festival, and the Beijing Music Festival, and are being revived in Edmonton, Canada, this year, with further productions planned for 2026, including in Finland next spring.

In the US, his productions include *Rigoletto* and *La Grande Duchesse de Gérolstein* (both for Santa Fe Opera), *Falstaff* (LA Opera, Dallas Opera, and Houston Grand Opera), *Orfeo ed Eurydice* (Minnesota Opera), *The Bald Soprano* and *The Maids* (New York), *The Barber of Seville* for Opera San José (which will be revived by Omaha Opera and Palm Beach Opera in 2026), and his British production of *The Habit of Art*, which received a New York Times Critic's Pick (during the Brits Off-Broadway season) last summer in New York.

#### **JAKE WILTSHIRE**

Jake designs extensively both in the UK and worldwide. His work has appeared with major opera companies and festivals, including the Royal Opera House, Welsh National Opera, Irish National Opera, New Zealand Opera, Garsington Opera and St Galler Festspiele, as well as at many of the UK's top music conservatoires. Internationally, he's worked throughout Europe, North America, and Asia in a variety of venues from traditional proscenium arch theatres to unique site-specific spaces. In 2009, he was made an Honorary Associate of the Royal Academy of Music and in 2023, he was nominated for a Canadian Dora Mavor Moore Award for outstanding lighting design.

Recent credits include: L'Olimpiade, a coproduction between the Royal Opera House, Irish National Opera, and Fribourg Nouvel Opera; Nabucco for Savonlinna Opera Festival, Finland; Albert Herring for Scottish Opera; Andrea Chenier for St Galler Festspiele, Switzerland; Don Giovanni for Kilden Opera, Norway; The Magic Flute and Don Pasquale for Welsh National Opera; Blue Beard's Castle for Theatre of Sound (Winner of the Royal Philharmonic Society Award) London, Atlanta, Beijing and Toronto: Amadigi and Le Comte Ory for Garsington Opera; Peter Pan for Haydn Fondazione, Italy; and Vixen for Silent Opera in association with ENO, (London, Helsinki, Trento, Hong Kong and Beijing). Jake has also lit multiple productions for Buxton International Opera Festival, Longborough Festival Opera, and Opera Holland Park. Previous RNCM productions include Theodora and Die Fledermaus.

Future engagements include *Der fliegende*Holländer for Trondheim Opera, Norway and *Il*viaggio a Reims for Oper Leipzig, Germany.

#### **BENJAMIN HUTH**

Benjamin Huth (Mills Williams Junior Fellow in Conducting) studied Church Music and Conducting in Leipzig and Detmold. He worked as an assistant at theatres in Leipzig and Cologne, and with the Academic Orchestra Leipzig. In 2020, he became a repetiteur at the Landestheater Detmold and, in 2022, he was promoted to Second Kapellmeister. During his time in Detmold, he conducted several productions including *Le nozze di Figaro*, *Das Land des Lächelns*, *Die lustige Witwe*, *Jesus Christ Superstar* and many more. He was also assistant conductor of the Detmold Orchestra Society and the Free Symphony Orchestra.

Benjamin has guest conducted at the Filarmonica Mihail Jora Bacau, Philharmonie Südwestfalen, Nordwestdeutsche Philharmonie, and Vogtland Philharmonie Greiz-Reichenbach. He has participated in masterclasses with Mark Heron, Johannes Schlaefli, and Ekhart Wycik. In 2021, he won second prize at the IX Concorso Internazionale per Direttori D'Opera 'Luigi Mancinelli'.

Before winning the Fellowship at the RNCM, Benjamin worked at Theatre Plauen-Zwickau.

#### **KEVIN THRAVES**

As a freelance repetiteur, Kevin has worked for many leading opera companies including Scottish Opera, Opera North, Welsh National Opera, English National Opera, Essential Scottish Opera, Clonter Opera, Batignano Musica nel Chiostro (Italy), Scottish Opera-Go-Round, and the Buxton International Festival. He has also worked alongside many of the UK's leading orchestras including The Hallé, the BBC Concert Orchestra - during the Proms season at the Royal Albert Hall, the BBC Philharmonic, Manchester Camerata, The Academy of Ancient Music, and the London Philharmonic Orchestra under the direction of Sir Simon Rattle, Barry Wordsworth, Sir Richard Armstrong, Tugan Sokhiev, Sir Neville Marriner, Sir Mark Elder, and Edward Gardner.

His work as an accompanist and repetiteur has led to many recordings and broadcasts for radio and television both in the UK and abroad. UK concert appearances include Wigmore Hall, the Purcell Room, Queen Elizabeth Hall, St John's Smith Square, St Martin in-the-Fields, the Royal Albert Hall, St David's Hall in Cardiff, and the Bridgewater Hall in Manchester. Kevin has a busy and varied recital career which has led to performances across Europe, Asia, and Oceania. Recently, Kevin was the co-chorus master for the world première of Mark Wigglesworth's Magnificat in Bergen, Norway, and the chorus master for performances of Puccini's Madama Butterfly for The Hallé.

Kevin is Deputy Head of Opera at the Royal Northern College of Music where he has worked on many of the award-winning operas as music staff, repetiteur and as the RNCM Opera chorus master.

#### **BETHAN RHYS WILIAM**

In 1996, Bethan was a principal lecturer in physical awareness, movement, and dance at the RNCM from 1996 until her retirement in 2022. During this time, she was choreographer/movement coach for the College's numerous and highly acclaimed opera productions. She is delighted to return as guest choreographer in this production of *L'étoile*.

Bethan was born in Swansea and educated at Altrincham Grammar School, Cheshire. After studying vocational dance at Bush Davies School, East Grinstead, her professional dancing career began with the Royal Opera Ballet of Ghent, Belgium and continued with Ballet International, the Iranian National Ballet, Malmö Stadsteater, and Northern Ballet Theatre. Her career included gala performances at the London Coliseum and Royal Festival Hall with Dame Margot Fonteyn and Rudolf Nureyev in his Nureyev and Friends seasons.

She was a founder member of London City Ballet. She has also danced on tours of Italy, France, Romania, and Norway. She has been a qualified fitness instructor since 1989 and has taught health related fitness in various further education institutions. During the 1980s, she appeared in several TV drama productions including the Welsh soap *Pobol Y Cwm* and, more recently, in Channel 4's *It's a Sin* and BBC's *Rules of the Game*. She also appeared in the 1978 BBC production *The Magic of Dance*, presented by Dame Margot, which was rebroadcast in January 2024.

#### **TOM DEAZLEY**

Tom Deazley is a young director from Belfast, Northern Ireland, and a graduate of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland where he trained with singers such as Iain Paton, Karen Cargill, and Dame Ann Murray. Finding himself in opera at a young age, he performed Miles in Britten's *Turn of the Screw* at the likes of Opernhaus Zürich, Kolobov Novaya Opera Moscow, and Northern Ireland Opera.

After graduating, he was a Young Artist at Nevill Holt Opera in their productions of *La bohème* and *The Barber of Seville* and performed in several shows with the Gilbert and Sullivan International Festival. As a director, he has completed observerships at Longborough Festival Opera with Sarah Fahie for their production of Puccini's *La bohème*, and at Wexford Festival Opera with Orpha Phelan for their production of Donizetti's *Le convenienze ed inconvenienze teatrali*. He has been a facilitating artist at both Ulster Touring Opera and The Playhouse Theatre Derry, and has assisted Anna Morrissey at Blackheath Halls Opera, and Mathilda du Tillieul McNicol at the Royal Opera House's Linbury Theatre.

#### **SAMUEL HORTON**

Samuel, from Stoke-on-Trent, studies under the tutelage of Mark Wildman. His operatic experience includes the roles of Male Chorus in the 2024 British Youth Opera production of The Rape of Lucretia, Mr Rushworth in the RNCM's Spring 2023 production of Mansfield Park, and Dr Blind in the RNCM's 50th anniversary production of *Die Fledermaus* (2022). In May 2024, Samuel performed as the tenor soloist in Finzi's Dies Natalis with the Amaretti Chamber Orchestra. He is also excited to announce that he will perform the role of Sir Philip Wingrave in Britten's Owen Wingrave for the RNCM in spring 2025.

#### **EDWARD WENBORN**

Edward is currently studying under Quentin Hayes and is excited to make his RNCM role debut as Zalzal. He previously obtained a degree in Classics from Durham University and has performed various operatic roles, including Pig in Leeds Youth Opera's 2022 production of Jonathan Dove's *The Enchanted Pig*. Recent career highlights include singing with The Hallé Orchestra and Opera North Chorus in Verdi's

Simon Boccanegra, receiving a choral scholarship with the Diocese of Manchester, and being highly commended in the 2024 Alexander Young Singing Competition.

#### JAY BROADHURST

Jay Broadhurst is a Manchester-born lyric tenor studying with Mark Wildman. For the 2023/24 season, Jay created the role of Stephen in the world premiere of Bicarrequi's Capsule and was an Alvarez Young Artist with Garsington Opera Festival. Operatic roles include Lensky Eugene Onegin (Preston Opera), Don Curzio Le nozze di Figaro (Garsington OperaFirst), Un Chef Le roi de Lahore (Dorset Opera Festival), Tsar Berendeyi The Snow Maiden (RNCM Opera), Spoletta Tosca (NPO), Preacher Bernstein's Mass (RNCM), and Macduff Verdi's Macbeth. Jay is generously supported by the Drapers' de Turckheim Scholarship and the Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation Scholarship.

#### **KRISTEN GREGORY**

Kristen Gregory, a 22-yearold tenor, is currently in his first postgraduate year at the RNCM. His opera roles include

Stephen in David Bicarrequi's Capsule, Mr Rushworth in Dove's Mansfield Park, Don Eusebio in Rossini's L'occasione fa il ladro, and Boggart in the RNCM's 2023 production of Rimsky-Korsakov's The Snow Maiden. In Dorset Opera's 2023 Le Roi De Lahore, he covered the role of Un Chef and will perform Gastone in their 50th Anniversary Gala Concert in 2024. Kristen was the tenor soloist in Mozart's Great Mass in C minor with the RNCM Chamber Choir and Orchestra. He is supported by the South Square Trust, the Gilbert and Sullivan Society Award, and the Andrew Lloyd Webber Foundation Scholarship.

# **WILLIAM JOWETT**

William is a Cardiff-born baritone currently in his fourth year of undergraduate studies. He was previously taught by Matthew Best and now studies with Mark Wildman.

His recent operatic experience includes performing as Tarquinius in *The Rape of Lucretia* (British Youth Opera), Blansac in *La scala di seta* (RNCM), Maslyenitsa in *The Snow Maiden* (RNCM), and as a Chorus member in *Die* 

Fledermaus (RNCM). William is the recipient of the 2024 Manchester Welsh Society Prize and won first place in both the Elsie Thurston and James Martin Oncken Song Prizes at the RNCM. He is also grateful to the lan Scott Award scholarship for supporting his studies.

# **CHRISTIAN LOIZOU**

Bass-baritone Christian Loizou is a graduate of the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland and is currently an ABRSM scholarship-holder at the Royal Northern College of Music, studving with Mark Wildman. He débuted at Wexford Festival Opera in 2023 as Moroccan Soldier No 2 in La ciociara (Tutino), and in the chorus, and returned in 2024 to sing the roles of Yeats and The Judge in the world première of *Lady* Gregory in America (Caruso). In 2024 he also appeared at Grange Park Opera, singing in the choruses of Aleko (Rachmaninov) and Daughter of the Regiment (Donizetti).

#### **CHARLOTTE BAKER**

Charlotte Baker is a soprano originally from Berkshire, studying for a PGDip under the tutelage of Mary Plazas. Her studies this year are generously supported by the Dame Eva Turner Award, the Riga Heesom Award, and the Hargreaves and Ball Scholarship. Charlotte is the 2024 winner of the Jovce and Michael Kennedy Award for the Singing of Strauss, and was a 2024 Young Artist for Buxton International Festival, appearing as chorus in Verdi's Ernani, and Carlos Acosta's On Before. Roles at the RNCM include Lucilla (Rossini's La scala di Seta, 2024) and Kupava (Rimsky-Korsakov's The Snow Maiden, 2023).

## KIRSTY MCNAUGHTON

Postgraduate Scottish soprano Kirsty McNaughton is currently studying with Eiddwen Harrhy, supported by the Eva Turner Award. #### **ROSA SPARKS**

British soprano Rosa Sparks is completing her postgraduate diploma at the RNCM, studying under Elizabeth Ritchie. During her studies, she won the Frederic Cox Award for Singing and received the Dame Eva Turner Award.
