

Define excellence in music by developing the next generation of exceptional artists and artistic leaders on the international stage; powerful and persuasive advocates for their art form, whose energy, imagination and creativity will influence the direction of music and ensure it remains relevant to future generations.

Position the RNCM as a world-leading hub for music experimentation, research and discovery; a living laboratory where students interact with professional partners to drive research and development, exploring how technology can stimulate creativity, enrich the art form of music and transform the way audiences access and engage with music.

Inspire students to see no boundaries to their creativity; giving them the confidence as interpreters, creators and researchers to enrich and diversify the art form and embrace their original voices and cultural heritage in their music-making.

Provide safe spaces where students can experiment with new and innovative ways of presenting their work; encouraging them to take risks and be entrepreneurial in how they engage and interact with audiences.

Actively promote student enterprise and startup activities; capitalising on our extensive partnership networks across Manchester and the North to provide access to the specialist support and mentoring needed to take ideas from concept to realisation.
